I'm reading through the book of Judges right now in my personal devotion times. If you've gone through Judges, you'll remember some of its stories are very inspiring, "God, lead me to have this kind of faith," some of them are encouraging with the happy reminder, "Well, at least America isn't THIS whackadoodle yet!" and some are convicting, "Ooh, America isn't as far different from this culture as I would like!" This morning, I was reading the story of Gideon. Most people remember Gideon either as the guy who had to test God twice with a fleece before he was convinced God was really calling him or as the warrior who eventually had so much faith in God's power, he was willing to attack 132,000 Midianites with only 300 men at his back.

The passage I was reading this morning, however, spoke about how before God used Gideon to make any forays against the enemy, He wanted Gideon to address the issues in his own household – namely the community shrine to Baal that his dad was in charge of. God wanted Gideon to cut it down and make an altar to Him using the destroyed idol as firewood. Know that normally, God was emphatically against the Israelites using any other place of worship outside of the bronze altar at the Tabernacle. The prohibition was a way of keeping their doctrine pure and their worshippers unified. This time was an exception because God wanted to make a point. "Gideon, I want as part of your offering to Me your destroyed idol-worship!"

Jen commented to me the other day, "I think God is using 2020 to get rid of a lot of our American idols." I started thinking about that statement. What had Christians in our culture been using to replace their reliance upon God? A false sense of immortality? Healthy economy? Sports programs? Extra-curricular activities? Unhealthy reliance upon political figures? Unbalanced desire for public acceptance and approval? Hollywood entertainment? (Goodness, we even lost our movie theaters for most of 2020!) Perhaps Jesus was taking Gideon's spot and smashing some of our idols for us during this last year's tumultuous events. Now it's up to us, though, to not only enjoy the freedom brought by our newly smashed idols, but to use their destruction as forms of worship and rededication. In other words, rather than spend our time begging God to give us our idolatrous culture back in this upcoming new year, maybe we should find ways to utilize what we've lost to rearrange our priorities, allegiances, and pursuits in order to dedicate ourselves more deeply to Him! If we did that, wouldn't it be interesting to see how He decided to use us in this upcoming year's adventure?
