David Mace tells me the phrase "Going postal" has been replaced in our common vernacular today. Now, when we want to convey that we're about to completely lose our minds to the point of exploding all over the people around us, we're to say, "I'm about to go 2020!"

2020 – Why has it become the subject of T-shirts, jokes, and groan-filled conversations? Is it because it's been the year of COVID-19 along with its accompanying shut-downs? Riots destroying our cities? Election season where people are divided over two political platforms that are so radically different? An emotionally-charged media that has been redesigned not to relay news but to raise blood pressure? (I'm not really speaking tongue-in-cheek with that last one. My dad had a clever nurse in ICU one time who turned on the news station he said he hated to get his blood pressure to come up to a more acceptable level. It worked!) All of those factors have surely contributed, no doubt, but life's circumstances have always been hard. The media has always been motivated by what sells or a channel of propaganda for whomever is trying to pull the strings. This world being an evil and difficult place in which to live is one of the constants we have been sure of since the fall.

I think what has made 2020 unusually difficult is the pervading spirit of anger that has so saturated our culture throughout all these difficulties. Whether motivated by our fear, indignation, or the slow realization our culture is losing its mind, we feel more and more that things are spinning out of our control, so we get angry.

Not all of that is bad. There is plenty in our culture to be legitimately angry about. You know the list. Passive apathy, though it might make us seem more peace-loving to others, is not the life Jesus lived or calls us to. But our question is, what are we doing with all our righteous anger? Allowing it to dictate our entire outlook when we're called to live the joy-filled life is not the answer. Proverbs 29:11 says, "Fools are quick to express their anger, but wise people are patient and control themselves." Know that in Proverbs, a fool is not a dummy, intellectually speaking. He could have a PhD from Harvard yet he's the one who unwisely lives for himself and he lives for the now, pursuing instant gratification regardless of long-term consequences or considerations of God's Law. He says with his heart (regardless of what he may say with his lips), "There is no God!" Therefore, his immediate concern on an issue isn't a careful evaluation of whether his anger is selfishly motivated, the ramifications of his anger on others, or the best way to utilize it constructively, it's how to vent it and voice it as loudly as possible so he can level any opposition with his forcefulness.

We Jesus followers are to be different. We don't look for opportunities to "Go 2020." We are "patient and control ourselves." We patiently consider what the other side is saying. We weigh both sides against God's Word. We weigh what God says in how to approach it. We allow Him to guide and/or restrain us so that we'll only act appropriately. Sometimes, the appropriate response is godly anger, but when dealt with wisely, it's then motivated by His Spirit encased in love and not by our own selfish perspectives encased in hate.

We don't have to wait until 2021 to start getting this right. We can work on it now and perhaps redeem the remainder of 2020!
