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Pews vs. Chairs. 10:30 vs. 11:00 Sunday Service times. One Service vs. Two Services. Hymns vs. Praise Choruses. We have had our share of things to disagree about haven't we? Why can't we just all think the same? Or if we do have to think so differently, why can't everyone else just not say anything and quietly go along with what *I* know is right?

Anytime we have a church with more than one attender, we're going to have disagreements, right? The important question is, what do we do with the disagreements when they arise? On one side of the spectrum is the bulldozer who doesn't care what anyone else has to say so he refuses to listen. On the other side is the people pleaser who refuses to ever say anything that they feel passionate about for fear of being disliked. Of course, neither one is healthy. But unfortunately, there's a whole other perspective altogether. I was talking to someone one time whom I believe was quite sincere in her claim that she loved Jesus yet she never wanted to go to church. When I asked her why that was, she said, "I just can't stand how people in church can't agree with each other." It was enough to drive her away and I have an idea she's not the only one.

So why doesn't the Holy Spirit just work in all believers in such a way that we'll all process His leading the same way all the time and therefore always come out on the same page on every issue without ever disagreeing or having to hash it out first?

I want to share something with you. Ted and I were reading a book together entitled, *Ministering to Problem People in Your Church* by Marshall Shelley. (And yes, of course it was all hypothetical. We were just reading about issues *other* pastors face.) In it, he was talking about a new believer named Pachomius in the AD 300's who really started questioning the lifestyle of ascetic hermits who secluded themselves from all people in an effort to pursue personal holiness. Shelley summarized Pachomius' conclusions like this:

How can you learn humility living alone? How can you learn kindness or gentlessness or goodness in isolation? How can you learn patience unless someone puts yours to the test? How can you learn to love if no one else is around? In short, he concluded, developing Christian virtues demands other people – ordinary, ornery people... True love isn't even learned among friends we have chosen. God's kind of love is best learned where we can't be selective about our associates. Perhaps this is why the two institutions established by God – the family and the church – are not joined by invitation only. We have no choice about who our parents or brothers or sisters will be, yet we are expected to love them. Neither can we choose who will or will not be in the family of God; any who confess Jesus as their Lord must be welcomed. We learn agape love most effectively in our involuntary associations, away from the temptation of choosing to love only the attractive.

Or in Fred paraphrase, "We don't get stronger by bench pressing feathers. Praise God for all our differences, even when they lead to frustrating disagreements!"
